W I N D B L O W N C L A Y S SINGLE VINEYARD PINOT NOIR 2013

From the Southern Valleys subregion, our Waimaunga Pinot Noir showcases its unique terroir A fine, pure and elegant nose, with cherry, blackcurrant aromas and a hint of spice. Subtle oak emerges on a layered savoury palate balancing the juicy dark fruit, all surrounded by a silky structure and generous tannins.

TERROIR & VITICULTURE

Named after the ancient glaciation period that formed this exceptional terroir, **Waimaunga** offers the purest expression of Pinot Noir from the clay soils. Following the French tradition, our vineyard is planted in **high density**. **Dry farming** and **organic practices** also allows us to ensure **natural vine balance** is achieved by stressing the vines just to the right level. This forces the roots to go deeper in the soil, obtaining the purest expression of our terroir and showing more **minerality** from the stone soils.

WINEMAKING

After hand picking, bunches are carefully sorted and 20% is kept as whole cluster while the rest is destemmed before being transferred under gravity into large French oak vats with no crushing. After spending a week cold soaking, natural fermentation begins. We are looking for light extraction through gentle pump overs and avoid plunging to rely on alcoholic extraction. Fermentation and post ferment maceration last up to three weeks. The wine is then aged for 12 months in 100% French oak barrels, 20% of which is new oak.

Relatively youthful wine with dried rose petal, raspberry, forest floor and black current bud flavours. The wine opened up significantly as it sat in the glass, making it a prime candidate for aeration.

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Highly impressive. Weighty, with concentrated plum, spice and nut flavours, a hint of earthiness adding complexity, and good tannin support. Excellent vigour, density and structure. Lovely now, but likely to peak 2026+.
